Budureasca Vineyards is a traditional region with strong roots in the history of vine cultivation. It is situated in the heart of the Dealu Mare region, in an area with sunny flowing hills. The nearby archaeological findings indicate that this area has a long history of vinification dating back to the Dacians or possibly their ancient Thracians ancestors. It is no coincidence that many significant Dacian terminology for the production of vines are still present in the language that Romanians use today. Words such barrel, barley, or grape highlight once again how important the Dacian heritage has been and is to the production of wines.

The Palace of Parliament, which holds the titles of largest administrative building for civil use in the world, most expensive administrative building, and toughest building in the world, is one of Bucharest's most remarkable and memorable structures. The People's House, as it was known during Ceausescu's dictatorship, serves as a symbol of the extravagance of the former communist regime. The solid wood furniture, large marble columns, huge crystal chandeliers, and other carefully chosen interior design components for each room make this palace one of a kind.

University House of Bucharest / Casa Universitarilor București

The building that hosts the University House of Bucharest/Casa Universitarilor București today was built by the blueprints of Dalmatian architect Luigi Lipizer in the seventh decade of the last century for the director of the Post Offices, Cezar Librecht, during the reign of Alexandru Ioan Cuza.

In 1947, the building was re-purposed to be used by the academic staff. For this purpose, lecture rooms, conference rooms, a cinema and a restaurant were made. The building has an eclectic style, but it also has features which are specific to the gothic architectural style, highlighted mostly by the cornice made up of a range of crenels, as well as by the alcoves present in the higher area of the facades. Starting with the year 2007, the University House becomes part of the University of Bucharest patrimony.
